- **Psychology** The study of the human mind and how it works, especially things affecting behavior
 - **Psychiatry** Similar to psychology but psychiatrists can prescribe medication
 - **Psychoanalysis** A system of therapy founded by Sigmund Freud
 - **Analytical psychology** A system of therapy founded by Carl Jung
 - **Viennese** Someone from Vienna, Austria
 - **Correspondence** Sending letters for communication
 - **Collaborate** To work together on something
 - **Heir** (In this case) A person who continues the work of someone important
 - **Inevitable** Unavoidable
 - **Personal repercussion** Personal unintended consequence of an event or action
 - **Prolific** Producing a lot of something
 - **Onniz** “On his“ (pronounced quickly)
 - **Too'wiz** “To his“ (pronounced quickly)
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Passage

Read the passage with the teacher, asking questions about content, and then answer the questions on the next page.

Carl Gustav Jung was a Swiss **psychiatrist** and **psychoanalyst** who founded **analytical psychology**. As a notable research scientist he came to the attention of the **Viennese** founder of **psychoanalysis**, Sigmund Freud. The two men conducted a lengthy **correspondence** and **collaborated** on an initially joint vision of human **psychology**. Freud saw in the younger man the potential **heir** he had been seeking to carry **on his** "new science" of **psychoanalysis**. Jung's personal research and personal vision, however, made it impossible for him to bend **to his** older colleague's ideas and a breach became **inevitable**. Jung considered **analytical psychology** to be the main task of human development, which was very different from Freud. This break was to have historic as well as painful **personal repercussions** that have lasted to this day. Jung was also an artist, craftsman and builder as well as a **prolific** writer. Many of his works were not published until **after his** death and some are still awaiting publication.
